President's Report

On the coast we have had a mild winter with a fair amount of rain and have been able to sail through the winter with almost no interruption. Those who sail in ponds and lakes have been blessed with high water levels and a lack of weeds. The IOM Western Championship is already history and the IOM World Championship is within a month with our IOM National Championship following rapidly on its heels.

I am happy to report that our current membership recently passed 170 which is about 20% greater than it was two years ago. What is more encouraging is that there are a substantial of renewals from members who have been lapsed for a number

of years. In addition our total membership count has passed the 1200 mark.

In parallel with the member count the boat register count is approaching 1800 boats. While many members own a single boat there are also a fair number of members supporting the model yacht building industry! While the recent surge in the RG65 class registrations generated by the Dragon Force design accounts for around forty new registrations, there is a steady flow of new boat registrations in the established classes - IOM, Soling and Victoria.

On the subject of membership and in particular boat registrations, we get a substantial number of these through our web site where the "SEND" before proceeding to "paying" has not been done. This results in receiving a PayPal notification that money has been received on the

CRYA's behalf. Unfortunately without the form being sent we are left wondering what for which results in an email exchange which adds to the treasurer and registrars work.

Organisers of CRYA sanctioned regattas are reminded that entrants must be members of the CRYA or their National Authority. I point this out as a Canadian national having a membership in the AMYA does not fulfil the condition. As all current members of the CRYA have been issued proof of membership this should be simple to check. A second condition is that the yachts being entered by Canadians must be registered with the CRYA. This again should be simple to ascertain. For owners who have lost or misplaced their registration proof we would be happy to re-issue the proof of registration.

This turnout is very encouraging and we expect another exciting summer ahead. There is the always room for new members and continue growth in the Alberta sailing community. Plans are also in the works for at least 4 Calgary sailors to travel to the Canadian Nationals on Saltspring Island early June.

The CRYA AGM results showed that the Alberta age demographics had an impact on the overall age average;


"Our membership is comprised primarily of those in their 60s and 70s. It should be noted that if Calgary is removed from these figures, the 40-49 age group would be nearly non-existent. This demonstrates that the Calgary club has been successful at cultivating a broader range of age groups and perhaps indicates an opportunity for other regions to grow and diversify their membership."

This without taking into account two new sailors aged 8 and 12 as well as our 15 year old who has been racing for the last 4 years and competes on a regular basis with some great success. So what are we doing different in Alberta then other provinces? Well one of the main focuses has been to get at least one or two pictures, notices and or updates onto our Facebook page every day, this page sees a lot of traffic and has provided us with a few new sailors. We also sail where there is good public viewing and put a controllers into any willing participant. Once a person has shown interest we find a reasonably priced used boat and help arrange delivery and set up as soon as possible. This option is getting slimmer since a lot of older boats have already been sold or the current owners do not wish to part with the extra boat. Another thing that all our current sailors have been doing are to encourage their friends who want to try RC sailing to come out and give it a try. The one thing in Calgary that has only happened a few times is the undertaking the building of a new boat, as time consuming as it is the results can be highly rewarding.

As the season starts, planning is in full swing for attending out of town regattas as well the planning for our September ranking event is going full steam.

By the time you read this report, we should have the results of the 2015 IOM World Championship, but right now, with a couple of weeks to go, tension is building all around the world boats are being tested and tuned. clothes and gear are being packed. and passports, plane tickets, and documents collected. The organizers are finalizing the catering and regatta gear, the helper teams and Umpires are assembling for the largest event in the RC Sailing calendar. There are 76 competitors, and even a large waiting list on standby in case of last minute drop outs. There should be daily updates on the main web site http:// www.usaiomworlds.com/ and I'm sure there will be many forum posts and Facebook updates to keep us current.

Barry Fox, as Secretary to the IOMICA has issued a reminder that we are now entering the annual cycle towards the AGM, and is asking for any proposals for motions and rules changes. Also he is asking for nominations for any and all of the officer positions on the IOMICA

Paul has been working toward getting the Soling database in order. This process will continue and with your help the process may be completed this year. So on to the news.

March obviously did not go without a fight. Many ponds were still iced over in the first week and a half of April, which delayed many spring startups to be sure. By this time your boats should be well tested and in the water for the season.

Soling registrations during the winter were slow which may mean very few new boats have been constructed. On the other hand there are over 410 boats in the database. Astounding! Maintaining an accurate database is important so if you have or know of an old Soling let the Soling Class Secretary know the number and who last used it. (solingtrack@gmail.com) At the very least an old boat can always use a good new owner.

The Law of Unintended Consequences strikes again – this time following an IRSA/IOMICA Technical Committee ruling on a question about the legality of a bracket under the boom, and a plate as pivot for the gooseneck/vang assembly. Saying that the 'pivot plate' is not compliant, has affected the legality of various vang assemblies commercially available. The timing could not be worse, as some boats coming to the Worlds may be using such parts. So again by the time you read this, there will be some form of emergency rule change by the end of April, so that the boats at the World's are not adversely affected. The ruling is here


Technical Report

From the IRSA The IRSA (International Radio Sailing Assoc. the RC sailing Governing body) has published a Case Book for RC Racing. It contains cases of special interest to RC racing, especially where Appendix E modifies the RRS.

The IRSA Case Book for Radio Sailing can now be downloaded at: www.radiosailing.org/documents/category/232-reports?download=257:irsa-radio-sailing-call-book

This document is undergoing a process similar to the development of the Team Racing Call Book (indeed some of the same people were involved). Naturally the IRSA Cases are not authoritative interpretations but it is expected that they will become widely accepted in the radio sailing community. In time it is hoped that this document will evolve in to an authoritative ISAF Case Book for Radio Sailing.



Regatta Reports

Beaver Fever Race/ Western Canadian IOM Championship Regatta Summary.

Barry Fox was Regatta Director and Lawrie Neish provided Regatta Measurement at Check in. There were 19 Canadian and 3 US sailors giving a total of 22 boats competing, and we sailed HMS heats of 14 boats with 6 promotions/relegations. Saturday had good No.1 Rig conditions with the occasional gusts to cause some dramatic nose dives and lots of shifts and dead spots to keep everyone on their toes. Eleven (two heat) races were completed on Saturday. Sunday was light winds and steady light rain. Wind shifts were massif, sometimes doing several 180s during a leg. The race course direction would be called at the two minute countdown, with some races going left to right, and the

next race right to left. Sunday races were reduced to one lap and produced some close finishes. Six (two heat) races were completed on Sunday for a regatta total of seventeen races, allowing three drops. At the end, we had a tie for first place, and Graham Herbert came out as Western Region Champion after a count back with more first place wins over US skipper Jerry Brower of Lake Stevens, Washington in second place. Peter Stevens, who will be representing Canada at the IOM Worlds was a close third, sailing his new V9 in its first big fleet regatta.

Thanks must go to the members of the host club VMSS for providing their facilities and for the club members who came each day and provided a hot lunch and assisted Barry with recording and scoring. And a huge vote of thanks to Barry who ran the event and did such a great job of keeping the regatta moving smoothly.


